Boy Scout Troop Leaders:

The Youth Aviation Adventure organization's next Boy Scout aviation merit badge program will be at Executive Air at Austin Straubel Airport on Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2013, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The admission fee is \$5 per person (youth and adults) paid online only.

**We need to limit attendance, so pre-registration is necessary. Walk-ins are not permitted. Please register and make your payment for each scout on-line at [Cavu Flight Academy](#).**

Once registered, the scout will be e-mailed information including a pretest and detailed preparation information for the day. Note: Prior programs were co-located with the EAA Young Eagles flight day. That program is not currently offered at the Austin Straubel Airport. There will NOT be flights after this event.

After each Scout has studied the aviation merit badge material, he should take the test that was e-mailed him. He should turn the test into one of your troop leaders for grading. The test's answer key will be provided to troop leaders that e-mail Sherwood Williams ([dr-w@new.rr.com](mailto:dr-w@new.rr.com)). The test consists of 40 questions. **Scouts should not wait until the day before the program to complete the test!**

We suggest that you have Scouts who missed more than two questions, restudy the material on the questions they missed to learn the correct answers. You may want to set a more stringent standard, such as requiring all your Scouts to restudy the material on all the questions they missed.

Finally, your Scouts should not bring blue cards to the program. We will have completed blue cards for them. They will also receive a YAA patch. **Scoutmasters approve the scouts participation in the program by signing the test where noted. Scouts must submit the signed test to receive a blue card. Scouts that forget the test will be allowed to complete the program but will not receive their blue card until the test is turned in. Also, discussion leaders at the program have absolute authority to withhold blue cards from scouts that are either not actively participating or do not appear to have mastered the material.**

**Each unit should designate ONE ADULT to pick up completed blue cards at the end of the program. Experience shows that handing each scout their blue card results in lost cards.**
